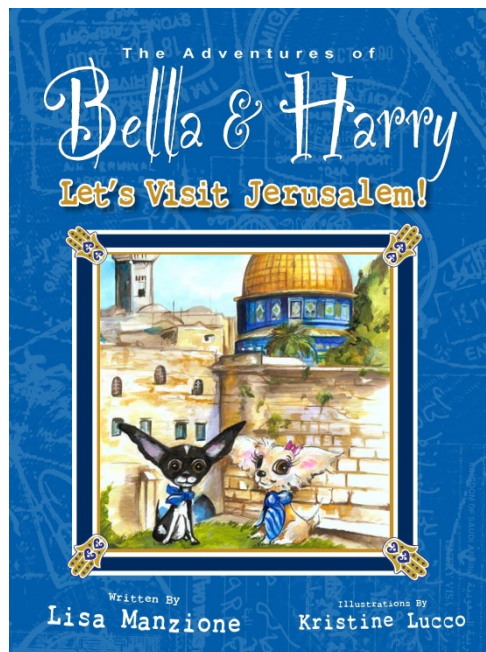


# The Adventures of Bella & Harry:

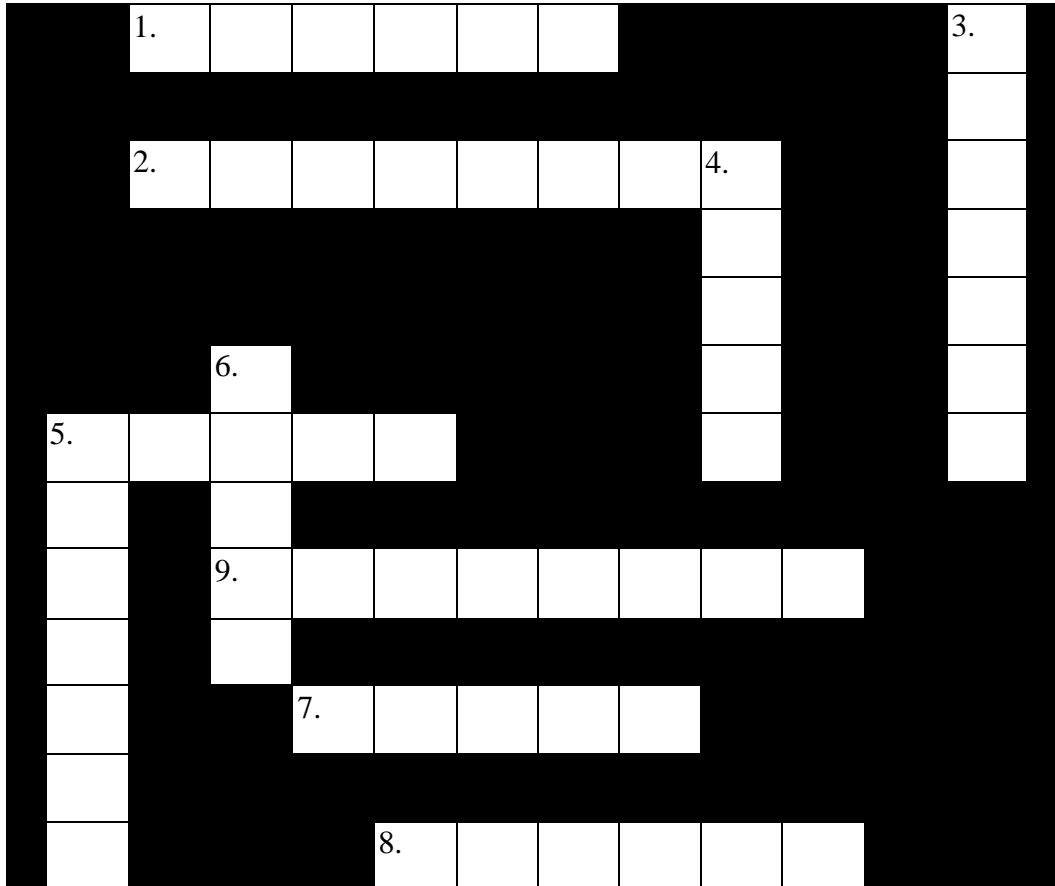

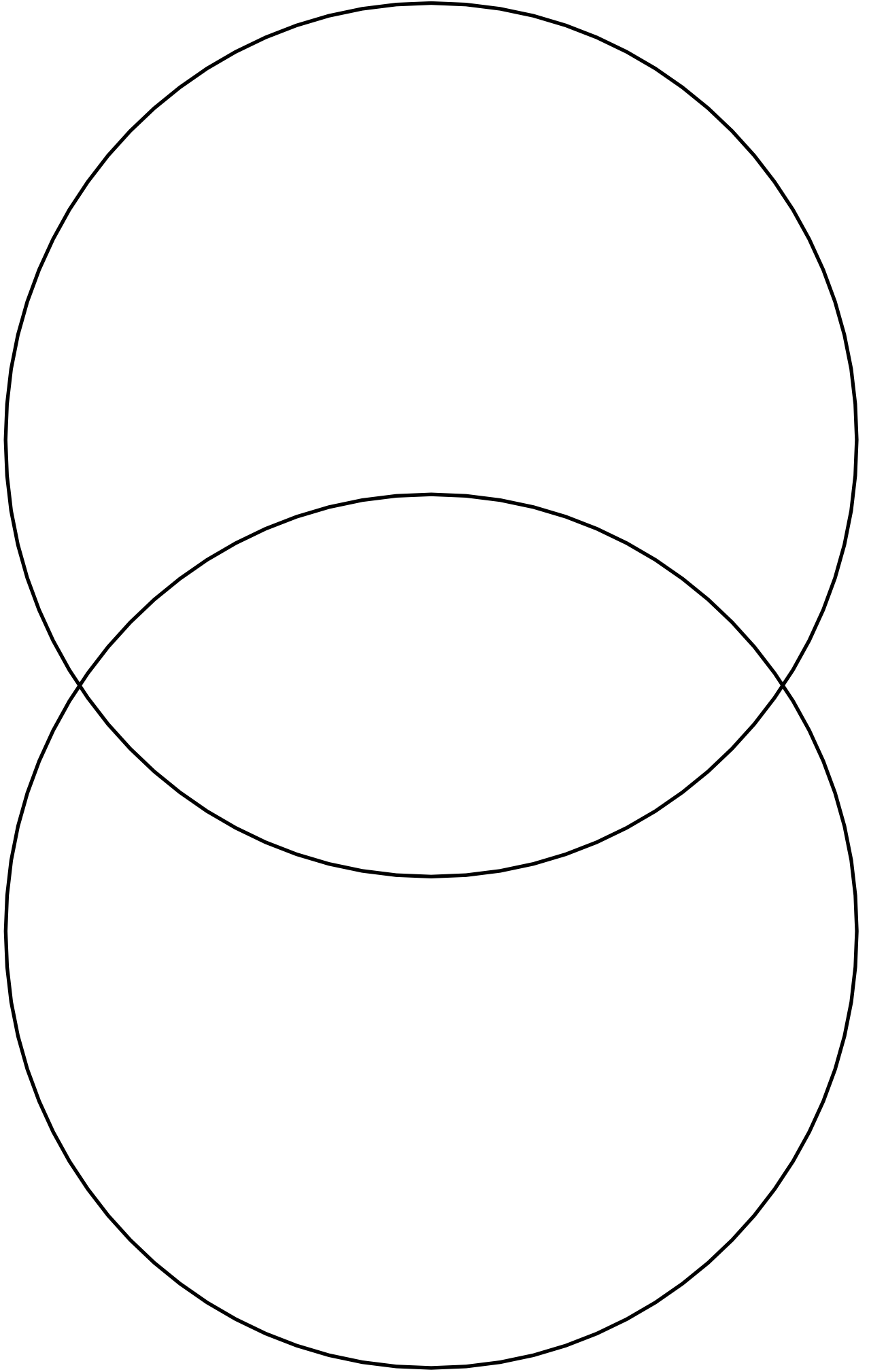

1. Where is Jerusalem located? **In Israel (which is located in the Middle East).**
  2. Because the weather is very hot during the summer, what are some items a tourist should make sure to have with them? **A hat and lots of water.**
  3. Who was Herod the Great and what was he known for? **He was a Judean king thousands of years ago. He was a great builder (built Masada, forts, palaces, cities).**
  4. How did the “Snake Path” get its name? Where does it go to? **It is a path that has lots of curves like a snake and leads to Masada, on the top of the mountain.**
  5. Why do they call one area of water the Dead Sea? **The high amount of salt in the water prevents life forms from living in it.**

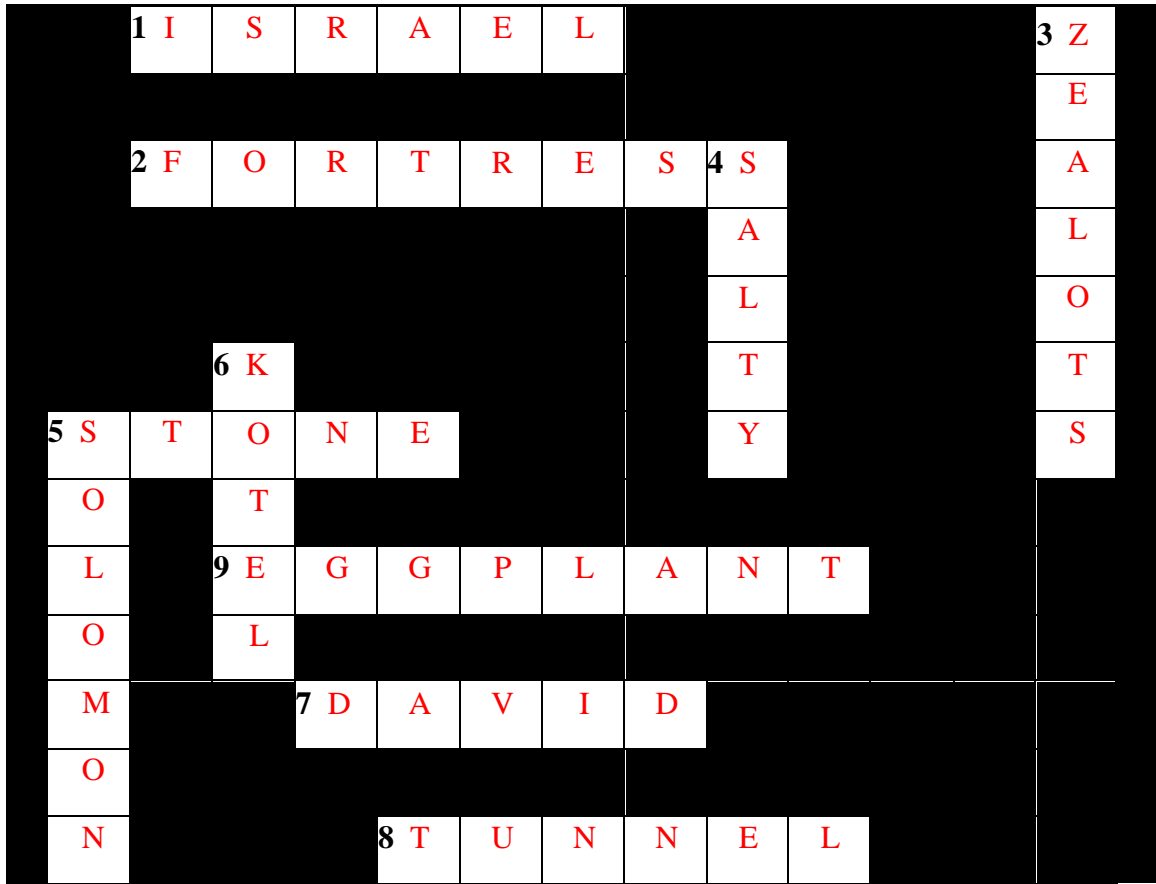
